National, Regional and Local Update

The APA Annual Meeting is upcoming at New Orleans, May 22-26. It will be a fantastic meeting. The Program Committee invited a few more sessions this year, drawing from the best researchers and clinicians internationally. With a de-emphasis of

Industry Supported Symposia, more courses by fabulous speakers (e.g., Glen Gabbard) were added. Please support the APA and the city by joining us.

An Oregon prescribing bill put through by the legislature was recently vetoed by the governor. We were appalled it had gone through and tried to support our neighbors and their families. From the Governor Theodore R. Kulongoski, "I have long advocated for mental health parity and improving the integration of mental health and physical health disciplines in order to improve the overall health of Oregonians, and increase access to services to underrepresented populations. However, I am concerned that Senate Bill 1046 as written creates serious policy and regulatory conflicts. Furthermore, I believe that a policy change of this significance requires more safeguards, further study and greater public input than was provided during the February special session." So, while this is a short-term positive, there is still work to be done.

We have a new slate of officers for 2010-12: Drs. Robert McCarron as President, Shannon Suo as President-Elect, Glen Xiong as Treasurer and Ranjit

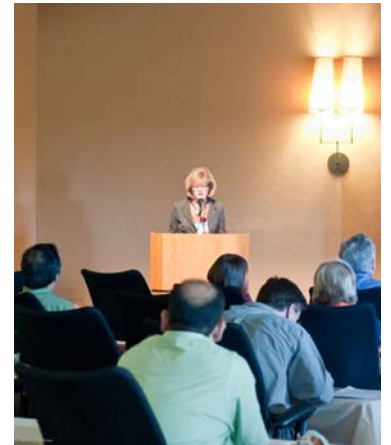

ASSEMBLY CORNER

First, I wanted to give you an overview of APA assembly role in the APA. APA assembly consists of 283 members from the District/State branches from USA and Canada. This number will be reduced in 2012 to 260 due to budget cuts. Assembly meets twice year once during APA annual meeting and second time in November usually in Washington DC. Any assembly member can initiate a paper of a topic of once interest and would like that paper to be approved by the assembly. Some of these papers are rejected by the review committee and never make it to the Assembly floor for voting. Some of the papers make it to the Assembly some get approved after discussion and voting and others get defeated. APA assembly follows parliamentary rules in their proceedings. Bills, which are approved then, go to Board of Trustees meeting for final discussion and voting for approval or rejection. Boards of trustee total nineteen in numbers have the authority to make final decisions on behalf of APA. Thus, APA assembly I view as an advisory body to APA board of trustee and bring forth wealth of information and address many current issues which concerns our profession . The decisions, which are made by APA make the head lines around the world in the mental health community and further influence the future direction for the mental health care recipients around the world. Each Assembly Representative supposed to be representing the will of its district branch members to the APA assembly; however, members rarely participate in providing any information thus assembly reps. are operating based on their experience and personal belief. I will encourage the members of CCPS if you have any issues which you would like me to consider to address to the APA assembly feel free to send me an e mail at rgoklaney@bak.rr.com . I will also like to suggest to CCPS council that we create a CCPS m2m communication so we could all communicate with each other on regular bases to address issues, which concern us and learn from each other to find constructive solutions. Lastly, I wanted to thank CCPS Council and the members for providing me the opportunity for years to represent CCPS to the APA assembly which I thoroughly enjoy.
